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

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
You are talking to your friends about what jobs family members do. One friend says their mum is in the army. Another one of your friends says this can't be true because women can't be in the armed forces.



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There is a special event at school where children can bring and share food their family has prepared. Your friend brings a curry which has been made from an old family recipe. Another friend comments that they won't eat it because they don't enjoy spicy food.



How do you feel about this and what would you do?

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You notice a child sitting alone at lunchtime. They are crying because some children have used unkind words that upset them.



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You are at the shopping centre with your friend's family waiting to use the toilet. A man walks out of the disabled toilet. Your friend's dad says that only people with disabilities should be using that toilet.

How do you feel about this and what would you do?



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You are playing in the park with your friend and a child you don't know comes and asks to join in. The child has long hair and your friend asks if they are a boy or a girl.

How do you feel about this and what would you do?




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A new child has joined your class. You notice them looking upset because they find the work difficult.
