Year 1 – Summer Block 2 – Singular and Plural – Adding 's' or 'es'

Notes and Guidance:

- Children should now have an understanding of the difference between singular and plural nouns, and that most plural nouns are formed by adding 's'. They should also now be familiar that all singular nouns ending in –s, -x, -z, -sh, -ch, or –ss must add 'es' to the end of the word to form the plural, instead of 's'.
- In this step children will practice using the two plural forms in their writing.
- Children will be able to select the correct plural form of nouns according to the rules and exceptions they have learnt.
- They will be able to complete sentences writing the correct plural form of nouns.
- By the end of this block, children should be able to identify between singular and plural nouns as well as correct and incorrect plural nouns.

Focused Questions

- Select the correct ending for the noun to make it plural.
- Is this plural noun correct? Explain your answer.
- Complete the sentence using a singular or plural noun and/or a correctly formed plural noun.




