Year 5 – Spring Block 3 – Tenses – Recognising the Future Perfect Form

Notes and Guidance:

- Once children are able to recognise and use the past and present perfect forms, they should move on to recognise the future perfect form.
- The future perfect form describes something that will happen at some time in the future, before another action. It is formed using will have followed by a past participle. For example: She will have fallen again before we replace the carpet.
- In this step, children should recognise when a verb is written in the future perfect form (including use within sentences).
