Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Reasoning)

**Expected** Identify which sentence is the odd one out and explain why. Includes multi-clause sentences and regular and irregular verbs.

**Greater Depth** Identify which sentence is the odd one out and explain why. Includes multi-clause sentences and regular and irregular verbs. Also includes sentences with multiple future perfect verbs and sentences in the negative form.

**Developing** Add the correct verbs from the word bank to the sentences. Includes single-clause sentences and regular verbs.

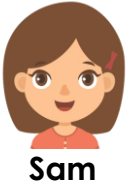

## Application and Reasoning

### Recognising the Future Perfect Form

#### Developing

- 1a. Sentence C is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 2a. A: called, B: opened, C: reviewed
- 3a. Mandy is not correct because 'will have' should come before the past participle 'listened' to make this the future perfect tense.

#### Expected

- 4a. Sentence B is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 5a. A: made, B: fallen, C: finished
- 6a. Ella is not correct because 'will have' should come before the past participle 'begun' to make this the future perfect tense.

#### Greater Depth

- 7a. Sentence B is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 8a. Various answers, for example: A: spent, B: tried, C: made.
- 9a. Sam is not correct because the future perfect form of the verb 'forgive' is 'will have forgiven' and the future perfect form of the verb 'forgot' is 'will have forgotten'.

## Application and Reasoning

### Recognising the Future Perfect Form

#### Developing

- 1b. Sentence B is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 2b. A: turned, B: watched, C: walked
- 3b. Gavin is correct because he has used 'will have' before the past participle 'climbed'.

#### Expected

- 4b. Sentence A is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 5b. A: driven, B: fed, C: built
- 6b. Ian is not correct because 'will have' should come before the past participle 'changed' to make this the future perfect tense.

#### Greater Depth

- 7b. Sentence A is the odd one out because it is the only sentence that is not written in the future perfect form.
- 8b. Various answers, for example: A: hidden, B: frozen, C: read.
- 9b. Charles is not correct because the future perfect form of the verb 'fight' is 'will have fought'.
