These children have taken part in additional activities such as visiting schools with daily mile tracks, before the design was chosen for our own school. PE and Sport has a high profile in school and because of this, the number of children participating in extra curricular sport is continuing to rise. Displays around school promote 'School Games' awards, clubs and teams and also provide information on healthy living.

The timing of clubs link to competitions in order to develop teams, but are also open to children not representing the school in teams. 64% of children from Yr1-6 (inc 86% PP ch and 76% SEND) have taken part in at least one series of sports clubs. Children who have not previously participated are identified by the sports coach and possible barriers to engagement are investigated. As a result of this, 79% of children who had not participated in 17-18, took part in a club in 18-19.
