Year 1 – Autumn Block 2 – Punctuating Sentences – Recognising Sentences

Notes and Guidance

- Now that children can correctly punctuate single sentences, they need to be able to identify the end of one sentence and the start of the next sentence.
- In the next block, they will learn how to identify sentences using their knowledge of nouns and verbs but for now it should be looking at natural breaks in two sentences, i.e. the postman gave me a letter the dog barked at him has a natural break after the word letter. The two sentences are linked together but the information in both is separate.
- Children should begin to spot these natural breaks in given sentences and be able to punctuate them with a capital letter and full stop accordingly.

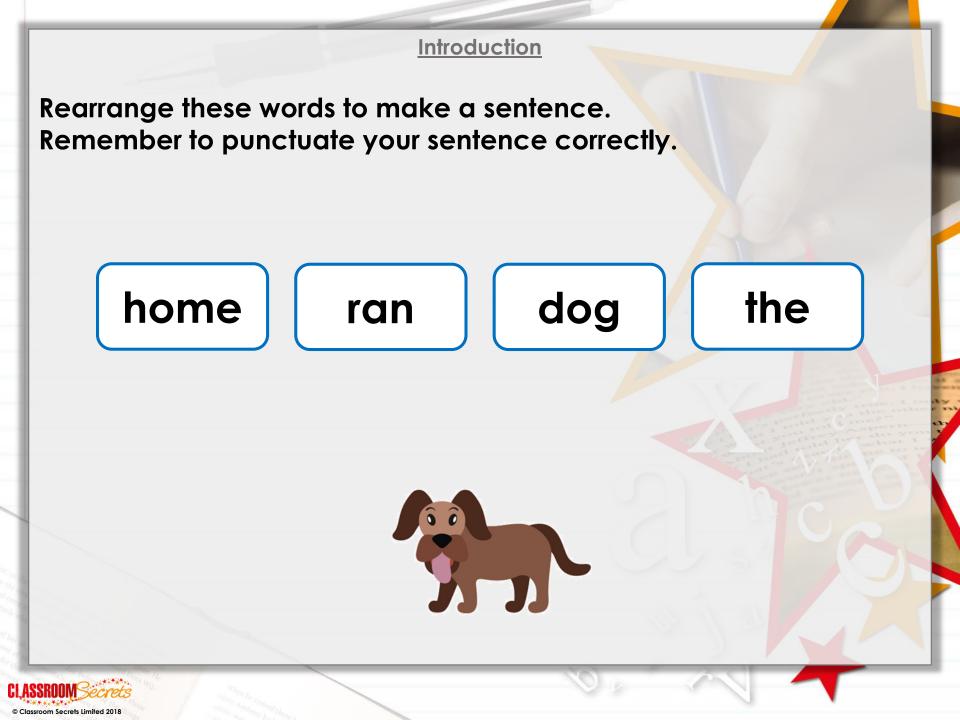
