Notes and Guidance

- In Autumn Block 4, children focused upon the use of capital letters for days of the week and months of the year. This block then built upon their learning to look at writing the date. This step aims to further consolidate their understanding of the use of capital letters for days of the week, months of the year and when writing the full date.
- Writing the date regularly allows children to practise spelling the days of the week and months of the year, along with capitalising the first letter of the days and months.
- Children should be taught to write the date in the format: Monday 12th November 2019.
- Remind children that the days of the week and months of the year are classed as nouns because they are names.

Focused Questions

- What is the date today? Can you write it out?
- Which words need capital letters at the start in this date?
- Which days and months will you never write in your books?


