Judaism is a religion

People who follow the
religion of Judaism are
known as Jews



How did Judaism begin?



Jews believe that around 4,000 years ago, God spoke to a man named Abram (who was renamed Abraham)

Jews believe that God told Abraham to search for a 'promised land'

This time is when Jews believe that Judaism began

What do Jews believe?

- that there is only one God
- that God made a covenant (special agreement) with them
- that God gave them the Torah and the Ten Commandments to tell them how to live their lives the right way

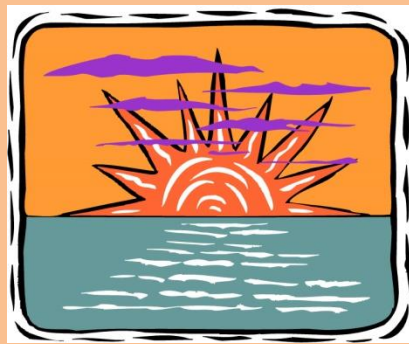
Hebrew is the ancient language of the Jews

Who are Jewish religious leaders?

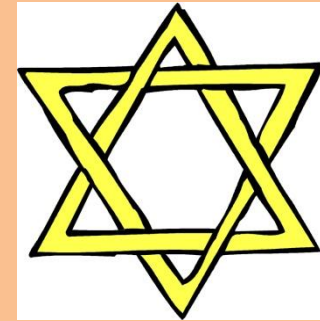
Jewish religious leaders are called Rabbis
