At Crestwood Park, we teach history in the autumn term. We use a key question model, supported by the 'Connected History' scheme to cover all elements of the National Curriculum. In Key Stage One, children study one history topic in the autumn term. In Key Stage Two, children study two history topics. In EYFS, children are taught about the past and present through books, stories, photographs and discussion.

In the summer term, we teach a whole school Local Area Study, where children learn about their local heritage. This study has been supported by Historic England. We host a Local Area Study exhibition each year for children to showcase their learning about our local area. We are very proud to have been awarded the Heritage Schools Award by Historic England.
