

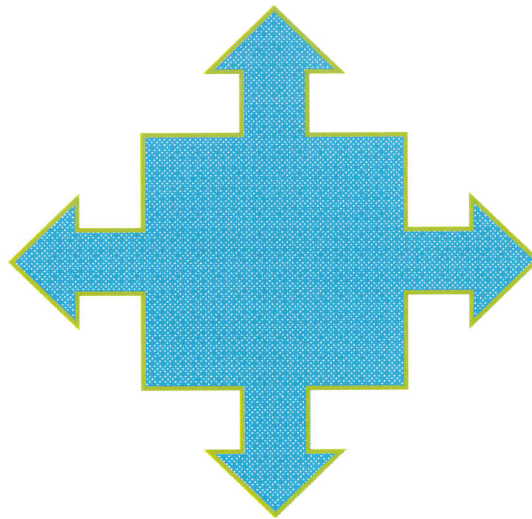
Figurative Language !

There are many different types of Figurative Language like : Personification, Metaphors, Similes, Alliterations and Pathetic Fallacy.



Pathetic Fallacy is a technique which gives your writing an atmosphere. It gives emotions to objects and the weather (which mainly reflects on what a character is feeling or what has happened in the story).

Similes compare two objects using 'as' and 'like'. An example for 'as' is 'as easy as ABC' . Furthermore an example for 'like' is ' I slept like a log ' .



Alliterations are when the beginning of each or most words in a sentence have the same letter or sound. The easiest way to use an alliteration is to repeat the starting letter of the words. An example of this is : Squawking seagulls swoop on sunbathers.

Personification is when inanimate objects have human-like features or do human-like things. An example of this is -
The stars danced playfully in the moonlit sky .

Metaphors make an even stronger image in the readers mind by describing a place, subject or object . An example of this is :
He was a speeding bullet.
