# Year 1 – Spring Block 1 – Conjunctions – Using 'or'

#### **Notes and Guidance:**

- In the previous steps, children have learned that a sentence can be made longer by adding the word 'or'.
- Now that the children can recognise the word 'or' in a sentence they can begin to start using the word in their sentences.
- This step focuses on using the word 'or' and how it can be used in a sentence to give additional information indicating two (or more) different options, e.g. Would you like red or green?
- Children should be able to use 'or' in a sentence and decide when it has been correctly used.

- Where does 'or' fit best in this sentence?
- Join the two short sentences together using 'or'.
- Explain why the word 'or' has been used in the sentence.
