Year 1 – Summer Block 1 – Questions – Question or not a Question

Notes and Guidance:

- Children should now be familiar with some of the vocabulary used to form questions and should be familiar with what is or is not a question.
- Some sentences open with question words but are not in fact questions (*What a lovely day, How clever, When the wind blows...*)
- In this step, children will move on to identifying different sentences where these words are used, as well as deciding if a question mark is needed or not.
