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<u>Application and Reasoning</u> Recognising Past Perfect Form

Application and Reasoning Recognising Past Perfect Form

Developing

- 1a. No, 'had cooked' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 2a. Various answers, for example: I had baked all day.
- 3a. Yes, the verb 'looked' is the past participle and is preceded by the auxiliary verb 'had'.

Expected

- 4a. No, 'had escaped' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 5a. Various answers, for example: Before I knew what was happening, I had fallen in the hole.
- 6a. No, the past participle of the verb preceded by 'had' has not been used.

Greater Depth

- 7a. No, 'had finished' or 'had decided' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 8a. Various answers, for example: She had run all the way back because she had worried about being late for the party.
- 9a. Yes because the verb 'written' is the past participle and is preceded by the auxiliary verb 'had'.

<u>Developing</u>

- 1b. No, 'had jumped' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 2b. Various answers, for example: I had walked all the way to school.
- 3b. No, the past participle is not preceded by 'had'.

Expected

- 4b. No, 'had left' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 5b. Various answers, for example: Due to the party being tomorrow, I had cooked all day.
- 6b. Yes because the verb 'jumped' is the past participle and is preceded by the auxiliary verb 'had'.

<u>Greater Depth</u>

- 7b. No 'had gone' should have been underlined because this is the auxiliary verb and past participle.
- 8b. Various answers, for example: They had heard a dog barking in the distance and had feared it was coming towards them
- 9b. No, the past participle of the verb preceded by 'had' has not been used.
