Application and Reasoning What is a Prefix?

Developing

1a. Various answers, for example: We made sure that it was a <u>fair</u> test. It was an unfair decision.

2a. Various answers, for example: True – I didn't have the key to <u>unlock</u> the door.

3a. Agree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into '<u>unload</u>' and '<u>unfold</u>'. You can unload and unfold jumpers.

Expected

4a. Various answers, for example: Troy and his brother were <u>equal</u> in size. My sister gave us an <u>unequal</u> amount of chocolate.

5a. Various answers, for example:
False – He was never <u>unloved</u> as a child.
6a. Agree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into '<u>unwound</u>' and '<u>untied</u>'. String can be unwound or untied.

Greater Depth

7a. Various answers, for example: It was <u>proven</u> that the crime was committed by her. The cause of the accident is still <u>unproven</u>.

8a. Various answers, for example: False – He was always organised and didn't like <u>unplanned</u> decisions.

9a. Agree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into 'unselfish' and 'unhelpful'. A person can be unselfish or unhelpful.

Developing

1b. Various answers, for example: Sophie didn't feel too <u>well</u> last night. Jan was <u>unwell</u> and went home.

2b. Various answers, for example: False – He wanted to <u>unpack</u> the toys from the box.

3b. Disagree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into 'untucked' and 'unhoped'. A shirt can be untucked but unhoped is not a word.

Expected

4b. Various answers, for example: Tom arrived home at the <u>usual</u> time. She gave him an <u>unusual</u> look once she found out his secret.

5b. Various answers, for example: True – He was given a voucher for an unlimited buffet!

6b. Disagree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into 'uncleared' and 'uncovered'. Treasure can be uncovered but cannot be uncleared.

Greater Depth

7b. Various answers, for example: Eli couldn't wait to get home and <u>install</u> the game on his console. He hated the game and wanted to <u>uninstall</u> it immediately.

8b. Various answers, for example:

True – Sandra <u>untwisted/unravelled</u> the rope from the bag.

9b. Disagree. Adding the prefix 'un' will change the words into 'unbeatable' and 'unfinished'. A warrior can be unbeatable but unfinished does not make sense in the sentence.
